6. B6 FLOOR

The sixth floor of the Berio Library, also known as B6, is one of the most scenic study rooms in the building. The space has unique characteristics as it is structured as a mezzanine of the fifth floor, and on the sides, it is possible to see the shelves made of precious Slavonian oak from the conservation section floor. The ceiling of the room is remarkable, featuring exposed wooden beams that create a beautiful warm atmosphere, perfect for concentration. In the past, the B6 floor housed the volumes of the Local Collection displayed on open shelves, but today it is entirely dedicated to reading and studying.
