A. THE GARDEN

Located in the center of the city, the green area of the Berio Library - sheltered by the different wings of the building - is highly appreciated for reading outdoors, taking a break from studying, or having a snack before resuming studying.

Just like the architectural structure, this part of the library also has an interesting centuries-old history. When the building housed the Seminary of the Clerics, the courtyard area was occupied by gardens cultivated by the young ecclesiastics. The D wing, which is now entirely windowed and covered with small domes, at the time was occupied by stables, which were useful for those living in the Seminary.

This unique past has left few traces in the current courtyard where, today, tables and umbrellas allows readers and students to enjoy this open-air space during the summer season.
