

## **B. CLERICS' CHAPEL**

**Located on the ground floor and accessible from the garden, the Clerics' Chapel is located in the seventeenth-century wing of the building. Its name comes from its ancient function: it used to be the chapel of the Seminary. The hall still shows the architectural style and original decorations from that period, including stunning Corinthian columns. This room now is frequently used for conferences, shows, and concerts, and is equipped with a projector, a sound system, and a mixer. It is quite spacious, and can accommodate up to 99 people in its 180 square meters.**

**In order to enhance the hospitality services offered to the citizens and to increase inclusivity, the conferences held in the old Clerics' Chapel are also accessible to people who are deaf or hearing impaired. The conferences are indeed subtitled in real time and displayed on a monitor. The subtitling service is complemented by the magnetic induction system for people wearing retroauricular hearing aids or cochlear implants equipped with a telephone coil or T-coil.**
